As a registered Voluntary Adoption Agency St David's Adoption Service offers an all-Wales intermediary service for parents whose child was adopted pre-1976. This service is funded by Welsh Government, who requested the National Adoption Service work with them to develop this service. The service supports you as a parent to gain information around the circumstances of your child's adoption and, if it is possible, offering support in tracing and potentially connecting with your child.

- We will support you by sensitively sharing information in a way that is agreed.
- We will support you in gaining understanding around any information shared.
- If possible, we will assist in tracing and making contact with your child.
- As agreed with you, we will refer you to Adoption UK for access to their support services if this is your wish.

We are here to act as a supportive professional helping you through what can be an emotional process by listening, offering advice, giving guidance and if possible assisting with tracing and making contact with your child.
