
The National Service supports adopted people in 4 ways:

CONNECT Voices is the name of our Youth Councils for adopted people. There are currently two councils for different age groups 14+ and 18+.

CONNECT Ambassadors work with Lead Youth Workers & CONNECT Voices to represent the voice of adopted children & young people. They attend & speak at events, talk to people like headteachers, politicians & social workers about adoption issues.
